Change the World School of Prayer

Mondays – November 14, December 12 – 7 PM

Our next Change the World School of Prayer teaching session will be held on Monday, November 14, beginning at 7 PM. Adult Sunday School Class

"Testing of Your Faith"

(Sundays at 9 AM in the Sanctuary)

Pastor Steve is leading a DVD series and discussion on the testing of our faith. The class is meeting during the Sunday school hour in the sanctuary as we continue to explore the Biblical truths about what happens when God sends a test of faith into your life, and how to stand firm and allow God to bless you through these tests when they come. In this study you will discover transformational truths about: (1) why we are tested, (2) the five wrong responses to tests, (3) how we are to live while being tested, (4) how to trust God and have peace during trials, (5) how every Christian can build his or her faith during a test, and (6) how to successfully pass a test of faith.

Monthly Senior Ministry

1st Tuesdays at 11:30 AM

November 1

Our Seniors met in the fellowship hall on Tuesday, October 4, for a noon meal, fellowship, and to learn a Bible study method that is used by Every Home for Christ called The Discovery Method. This biblical study is used by millions around the world once they have been introduced to Jesus and want to learn more about Him as a disciple and follower. The Bible is built mainly around stories (70%) so we learned how to understand the Biblical story using the Discovery Process and the Application Process. Each process is built on three parts. Discovery: (1) Know the Story – characters, actions, detail? (2) Understand the Story – emotions, choices, motives? and (3) Discover the truths – right thoughts and actions, loving God, loving others? Application: (1) Rebuke the past ("Have I always lived according to this biblical truth, (2) Correct the present ("If my past behavior does not match up to biblical truth learned, then what must I do to correct my current behavior?", and (3) Train for the future ("What must I do to prepare myself to always live according to this new biblical truth?")

We then did a Bible study on "Do Not Worry" based on the story when Jesus and the disciples were in a boat when a terrible storm arose (Mark 4:35-41). We used the discovery and application questions and had a great engaging study where everyone was able to give their input. We learned that this type of Bible study is one that anyone could lead with others. At our next gathering in November we will be learning the 12-Step Prayer Program from Every Home for Christ that was developed by Dick Eastman that can be a guide as we seek to pray daily in our own "Gap" room. Come and join us for this informative and practical time of teaching and application. The two keys to maturing in our faith are Prayer and God's Word.

PASTOR STEVE'S LETTER: "Embracing Gratitude as a Way of Life Sustains Community"

Each month we are examining four critical practices that make living in community not only necessary but when expressed make for a beautiful community that attracts others. These necessary practices are (1) Truth-Telling, (2) Gratitude, (3) Promise-Keeping, and (4) Hospitality according to Christine Pohl in her book "Living in Community: Cultivating Practices That Sustain Us." Last month we talked about "truth-telling" so in the month where we observe a day to "give thanks" (Thanksgiving Day), let us look more closely at "Embracing Gratitude as a Way of Life." Most of us do fairly well with occasional expressions of gratitude to God. We give thanks for our health, families, salvation, daily food, and unexpected blessings. But embracing gratitude as a "way of life" is more—it is a picture of our heart—a body, a life—pulsing every heartbeat with gratitude. If we really understand our lives as "redeemed by costly grace", then our primary response can only be gratitude. It becomes the CENTER of the Christian life. Karl Barth (theologian) wrote that grace and gratitude "belong together like heaven and earth. Grace evokes gratitude like the voice of an echo. Gratitude follows grace like thunder [follows] lightning."

The word "gratitude" comes from the Latin *gratia*, which means "grace" or "graciousness." Similarly, in Greek, grace (*charis*) and thankfulness, thanksgiving or gratitude (*eucharistia*) share the same root. If grace and gratitude are so central and belong together, why are they not more prominent in how we live? A couple reasons why gratitude is not at the center of our Christian life are entitlement and unrealistic expectations. With an entitlement mentality we are lured into the false and dangerous thinking that we deserve to be heard and that somehow our voice is more important than others. And when situations don't go our way or our voice is not the voice that is followed, complaint and frustration rise within us. Or ingratitude can raise its ugly head once we start focusing on the flaws of a community. There are always things about a community or congregation that will disappoint us, and because our expectations for the church are high, disappointment and frustration can run very deep. When we yearn for some ideal of church, it's easy to grow increasingly dissatisfied with what we have. Thus, there is always a tension between being grateful for what we have AND striving for excellence.

Although writers in the Christian and philosophical traditions have given substantial attention to gratitude (and gratitude is central in Scripture), gratitude as a central way of life has been mostly overlooked as a needed practice for community life. Gratitude is so vital because it sustains communities that are holy and good. Far too many communities are being plagued with an epidemic of complaint, envy, presumption, and dissatisfaction which undermine human relationships. These forms of ingratitude are deadly: "they kill community by chipping away until participants long to be just about anywhere else." (How many former CTS members do you think have left our congregation for this very reason? More than you realize if you have ever talked with them about their reasons for leaving.) Christine Pohl writes here these words: "While gratitude gives life to communities, ingratitude that has become established sucks out everything good, until life itself shrivels and discouragement and discontent take over." The apostle Paul understood the communal importance of gratitude when he encouraged the early Christian congregations to see that at the center of their life together was "giving thanks to God the Father at all times and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Eph. 5:20). Ingratitude toward God and human beings is a terrible thing, but it often comes dressed in other clothing—restlessness, concerns for self-fulfillment or

entitlement, and irritation at not being properly valued or recognized. And once a "culture of complaint" is established, it spreads through communities and affects everyone!

Perhaps a quote by Dietrich Bonhoeffer can remind us why gratitude and appreciation are so needed in a congregation when both are in short supply in society.

"We pray for the big things and forget to give thanks for the ordinary, small (and yet really not small) gifts. How can God entrust great things to one who will not thankfully receive from Him the little things? If we do not give thanks daily for the Christian fellowship in which we have been placed, even where there is no great experience, no discoverable riches, but much weakness, small faith, and difficulty; if on the contrary, we only keep on complaining to God that everything is so paltry and petty, so far from what we expected, then we hinder God from letting our fellowship grow according to the measures and riches which are there for us all in Jesus Christ." (Dietrich Bonhoeffer, *Life Together*, p. 29)

Kevin Rains (Vineyard Central Church, Cincinnati, Ohio), after being reduced to tears when he read Bonhoeffer's quote, wrote these words in response:

"I can only imagine if this advice was heeded by even a fraction of a local church—the effects could be revolutionary. How many times have I wished I were somewhere else where God was REALLY moving? How many times have I longed to be in a more beautiful place (with mountains or an ocean) and abandon the urban neighborhood where I live? How many times have I fantasized about the perfect fellowship where everyone got along like a perfect family? What this boils down to is spiritual pornography . . . creating a mental fantasy of a perfect place or people and not recognizing the good things all around me. This spiritual porn is my nemesis. It's poison. Thankfully, the antidote is available and accessible: equal parts of gratitude and affirmation."

When people enter to our congregation to worship and gather together, what spirit pervades our conversation and actions? If someone was to sit down by you in worship or in a conversation after worship, what attitude would they hear from you? May we make our goal to be what Paul writes in Colossians: "And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him" (Col 3:17).

In Every Situation Give Thanks to God!

PASTOR MATT'S LETTER:

*The LORD is near to all who call upon Him, to all who call upon Him in truth. He will fulfill the desire of those who fear Him; He will also hear their cry and will save them. **Psalm 145:18-19***

Father's Day will never be the same. Now, I know many of you have experienced the loss of one or both parents, and there are many who have not; but I am just admitting that facing Thanksgiving and the "holidays" without someone for the first time is always a challenging task. But Father's Day; that seems to be stuck in my head right now. And the other word that comes to mind is failure. Even worse is that I have that same word with my mother's passing. Perhaps I am not alone. The fact is we have all heard it said, "you never know what you have until it's gone."

Now it is different with my dad. With mom, I just was too young, too "busy," too yeah, in other words I had too many excuses and I just didn't comprehend the value of learning about my mom's life. I missed out on something with my mom and for years I wrestled with that, but with Dad, even Becky knew this was a challenge. Who would I talk to now? He and I had been engaged for years and yet I will admit in the majority of my life outside of middle school, I was "too whatever" also with my dad. But when I was young and in the past 18 or so years, he had been my go-to person. When, as a kid, I would wake up in the middle of the night from a dream about losing my parents, my dad was always the one who would get up, go out to the living room with me and talk. I would ask about heaven and what it would be like and my dad helped me, from the Bible and not the cultural ideas of heaven, understand that when we would be there it would be together as a family worshiping God and sharing in His love. Now of course that is paraphrasing, but to a kid who was asking questions like, "In heaven will you know me?" it was to the same point.

Why those questions came – I don't know. Why I kept looking to be assured – I don't know. But, what I do know is that my dad knew God, his faith, and the Bible clearly enough that he would share life with me. I say all this to note, that I stopped asking questions when I became "too whatever." But as I began at the seminary, and began looking at my kids – the value of questions became more important. Without asking the question no information would be offered and the implied opportunity for bonding and relationship is lost. I have heard so many people say, "I wish I could have asked about ..." and yet I still didn't ask as I should. Even after my experience with my mom... I still didn't. Why? Because: first, somehow I always assumed my dad would be around, second, because I didn't take the time and make it happen, and finally, because I didn't have the questions that could have changed my life and developed our bond.

The psalmist reminds us that God is longing, waiting, and is present to hear the voice of each and every one of His children if they will but call upon Him as He should be called upon; in His will and in His way with humility and truth. God, our Father, neither slumbers nor sleeps and will never pass away. It really is a relationship that is worth our building our bonds with and taking the time to grow. God is here to hear, and we are sought after to come. Looking at what a relationship can become with God then reminds me also how valuable the relationships are that are around us in family, neighborhood, and congregation but how so often we don't tend that growing and don't teach our kids and young people to grow this as well from an early age.

So I will give you a few questions, that now I wish I could ask my dad, but I will have to ask some of you. So you can also ask them of others and together we can be bound together in the relationships and unity that God so intended and longs for in His Church and world. I have more, just come and ask, and sit awhile and talk.

- *What did you have as a child that kids today don't have?*
- *Think of some relatives that have passed away in the last few years. What would they be doing right now if they were with you?*
- *What was the hardest thing you went through as a child? How did you overcome it?*
- *If you could go back to one day in your childhood, which day would that be? Why?*
- *How are you most different from your parents and grandparents? How are you the same?*

God is always near. And because of Jesus so is my dad.

September 19, 2016

Opening prayer by Warren. Minutes of the last meeting were approved online and have been published.

Financial report: Reviewed data through the end of August, noting that offerings were down last month.

Motion by Wanda to accept the financial report; seconded by Warren; motion carried.

Bills for approval:

Christen-Brozek-Faltys in the amount of \$1,796 (represents 3 months). Steve explained that the original bid was \$208/month (\$4,200/year) but he misunderstood what was included in their bid, which has resulted in charges being approximately \$250 per month higher. Basically, it is costing us that much to generate the reports that used to be done by financial secretary. His opinion is that it is not worth that much money just for a report if we can do it ourselves. It was noted that it costs \$107 per month for C-B-F to do our payroll and quarterly payroll reports to the IRS. Motion by Richard to not continue to pay \$250 per month and instead go to a self-generated report system, seconded by Jan; motion carried. The bill for work already done by C-B-F was approved for payment.

K&B Construction in the amount of \$4,536 (concrete work). Motion by Richard to approve paying this bill, seconded by Jan; motion carried.

Jan reported that the decision was made to buyout to keep the printer/copier we had been leasing from Toshiba. This board thanked Warren for his donation for this purchase in memory of his wife, Sheryl.

Teen Mom Childcare Program: Danita Broders

Danita reported on the childcare program as well as "Embrace Grace." We are the first organization in the state of Nebraska to offer this program. This is a 12-week program that starts October 10 and is for unplanned pregnancies before the baby is born. The cost is \$30 per girl and they are looking for sponsors. She has a newspaper interview on Wednesday. Danita expressed her desire to become the permanent director of the Childcare Program, and this board unanimously approves of such.

Property: Wanda stated that the deck at the parsonage needs to be replaced, and this is a goal for next year. Steve reported that new windows have been installed at the parsonage. Regarding sod where the sidewalk was removed, Warren stated we could lay the sod ourselves for less than the \$400 estimate from K&G Construction, and offered to look into it. Motion by Jan authorizing Warren to check the price of sod, purchase and install it; seconded by Wanda. Motion carried.

Membership/Stewardship: 30% less was given than pledged so there will be no pledge cards this year. Electronic giving through Thrivent includes a \$20 monthly service fee. This will be presented to the congregation on Nov. 15 with a sign-up sheet for those who want to give online.

Finance: reports were not available at the time of this meeting. Property insurance is going up from \$5,448 to \$5,847. Discussed raising the deductible in order to lower the premium. Motion by Jan to leave deductible as is, second by Judy; motion carried.

Property:

- Wanda shared three bids for flooring in two rooms used for childcare (carpet in the sleeping area, laminate in the eating area). Flooring in the center room (play area) does not need to be replaced at this time. No objection to proceeding with this project.
- Warren paid for the sod along the west side of the building where the sidewalk was removed and will be reimbursed.
- Water leaked into the library during a recent heavy rain; gutters need to be cleaned. Fascia needs to be painted or it will rot; probably too late this season but needs to be a priority next spring.
- Water to the fire pit area and the sprinkler system has been shut off.

Bills for approval:

- \$407.50 to JB Construction for labor to install two remaining windows in the basement of the parsonage
- \$553 to Scranton Flooring for purchase of two windows and door face

Motion by Wanda to approve both bills, plus Warren's, second by Richard; motion carried.

Motion to adjourn by Richard, second by Warren. Meeting adjourned at 8:45 p.m.

A MESSAGE FROM CHRIST THE SERVANT MEMBERSHIP AND STEWARDSHIP MINISTRY TEAM:

On Sunday, November 13, our congregation will recognize our time, talents, and treasures during our worship service for 2017.

In the past, we have used faith promises or pledges to help in our planning for the coming year. While all of our giving is based on faith, this coming year we are inviting you to consider a new way of giving — Simply Giving. Simply Giving is an online giving plan where your offerings will be drawn directly out of your checking account and transferred to our church account. You can decide how often these transactions will occur — weekly, bi-weekly, or monthly.

We are offering this type of giving because we are often gone on numerous weekends during the year. When we return to church the next week, we may find it difficult to give a double offering or more. However, if we had a consistent way to give (especially when we are absent) that would help us maintain our faith promise on a regular basis. Thus, Simply Giving is an excellent way to be regular, consistent and faithful in our giving.

We reviewed last year’s faith promises for this year and compared these faith giving units in the first nine months. While we each intended to fulfill that faith promise, we discovered that these faith promises were behind by 30 percent so far this year. Possibly we were gone many weekends during the summer and absent from worship at Christ the Servant. By using the Simply Giving plan, our offerings during the nine-month period would have been closer to 100 percent. Do you see the potential in giving and ministry opportunities that would occur in our congregation with an increase of 20 to 25 percent with Simply Giving.
