Pastor Steve's Letter: **"That Power is Still the Same"**

Do you sometimes feel like you have lost most of your strength and power? Do you feel like you are running on empty most days? Do you long for renewed strength and power again in your life? In these days following Easter, I have found my mind wandering (or wondering) toward the renewed strength and power that the disciples exhibited after the resurrection of Jesus from the dead and His sudden return to the heaven 40 days later (Ascension Day). How did that happen? What was now different than before? How did these scared, frightened disciples move beyond their locked doors into the world with renewed purpose and vigor? I realize seeing Jesus alive would be a major motivator, but the risen Christ was not with them long (only 40 days). What was the key to their renewed faith and hope? The key was Pentecost and the power of the Holy Spirit in their lives! After Jesus ascended into heaven, Jesus told His disciples to go to Jerusalem and wait for the promised Holy Spirit (Acts 1:4-5). Then we are told, **"they all joined together constantly in prayer"** (Acts 1:14). And when the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples, well, you know the rest of the story.

Scholars have debated about the day of Pentecost ever since. Some have suggested this power was given only to the early church. Others have suggested only parts of it have continued to this day. Still others believe this same power is available to every believer in Christ today (this is my belief). So if this Holy Spirit is still present in our world, why don't others see His works and power more often around us? Well, the simple answer would be this: we have not called upon the Holy Spirit in prayer to show us God's purposes and ways and we have relied far too often on our own strength and efforts. And human strength will only take us so far. And tragically today, the world is watching to see if any God-explained things are happening in and through us. You see, you and I are meant to be channels of the Holy Spirit in this world. The fruit of the spirit (love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness and self-control) are to be more evident in our lives each and every day. If not, we are not producing the much fruit which brings glory to God (John 15:8).

So here is my prayer for all of us. It is the same prayer that Paul said for the church in Ephesus. Listen again to his prayer and ask the Holy Spirit to reveal to you what you need to hear in it today as you read it.

"¹⁵ For this reason, ever since I heard about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all the saints, ¹⁶ I have not stopped giving thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers. ¹⁷ I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better. ¹⁸ I pray also that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, ¹⁹ and his incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is like the working of his mighty strength, ²⁰ which he exerted in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms, ²¹ far above all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every title that can be given, not only in the present age but also in the one to come. ²² And God placed all things under his feet and appointed him to be head over everything for the church, ²³ which is his body, the fullness of him who fills everything in every way."

Did you hear and understand what Paul said in his prayer? He is praying that the church in Ephesus (post-Easter and post-Pentecost) would be able to comprehend this incomparable great power that raised Jesus from the dead. This power is available to all who believe and are seeking to be "in Christ." Paul is praying that we may be given this same "spirit of wisdom and revelation" and that the "eyes of our heart may be enlightened." It is in this power and in this revelation that we are given the very power of the Holy Spirit to do great things for God and His Kingdom.

As we move into the summer months of activity, may your bodies be refreshed and renewed. May you come to worship seeking to be filled with the power of the Holy Spirit. May you "keep on asking" God the Father to give you this "Spirit of wisdom and revelation." The summer months are part of the longest season of the church year – the Pentecost Sundays – i.e., seeking to live and be guided by the Holy Spirit.

Congregational Meeting

June 3 following worship

Our leadership boards (Spiritual Oversight and Administration) have reviewed and approved a new constitution for the congregation of Christ the Servant. This new constitution has been mailed to every household for your review. The main reason for a new constitution is, after governing with two separate boards since 2010, both boards have concluded our congregation would be best served by having only one board which will be called the Congregation Council. This Council would be composed of four officers (President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer), six At-Large Congregation Council members, and the Senior Pastor. All members of the Congregation Council would be elected by the congregation. If this new constitution is approved on June 3, the new Congregation Council would be elected on July 1 and begin its term of office immediately following the July 1 vote.

Please read through the new constitution before our June 3 meeting. Nearly everything in the new constitution is the same as the old constitution except those chapters which relate to Officers (Chapter 14) and Congregation Council (Chapter 15). Once the congregation decides on a constitution, the Nominating Committee will meet and present names needed for our election. Please note: the congregation will have the opportunity to give names to the Nominating Committee in addition to their list.

OLD BUSINESS

Parsonage deck fund: activity in this account has fallen off. Richard would like to close this account and transfer the money to the general fund. Motion to close parsonage deck fund by Wanda, second by Warren; all voted in favor, motion carried.

No word yet from T&H Drywall, per Warren. Wanda would like names and phone numbers of painters if anyone knows someone.

Warren is still looking at lawnmowers. The least expensive is John Deere. Cost would be \$3,900 for zero-turn 48" deck (same size as what we have, which fits in the shed). He suggested a fund for the mower like we did for the deck; this could be put in the bulletin. Warren will pursue this, as \$5,500 was budgeted. Motion to approve purchase of new lawn mower by Wanda, second by Steve; all voted in favor, motion carried.

REPORTS

- Membership/Stewardship: Pat's committee is looking at doing another Neighborhood Welcome in April. Doris will talk with Pastor about calls as well as inactive members.
- Personnel: Steve's committee will meet with Kathy and Pastor Steve at 3:00 Thursday.
- Property: Wanda will show Richard where the carpet needs to be stretched. Richard suggested we look at remodeling the unisex bathroom.
- Financial report (attached): Motion to accept by Steve, second by Warren; all voted in favor, motion carried. Motion to approve payment of \$1,347 for copier maintenance by Steve, second by Jan; motion carried. This item was not in the budget but should have been included.
