Confirmation and Affirmation

October 25—besides being Reformation Sunday—is a very important day in the life of this congregation as we will celebrate the Rite of Confirmation and Affirmation of Baptism with seven of our youth. The Rite of Confirmation is the celebration of a Ministry Milestone that began with the mark of Taking on Your Faith. Beginning to learn about God, his Word and will for our lives, and to begin to take it on in practical ways. The Rite of Affirmation of Baptism is the historical declaration of a youth that I am now taking responsibility for my faith, as they affirm the baptismal vows that were made for them by parents and sponsors at the font of God's blessing. The week prior they will be presenting their Faith Papers to the Board of the Congregation and before parents and sponsors. Please pray for these young men and women that the Holy Spirit would touch them and that faith would become alive in them, for confidence in their papers, and joy at being members of the body of Christ in this congregation.

We encourage you all to attend that special worship to help support our youth and demonstrate the power of the Church of Jesus Christ as we stand together in our faith over the vows and the creeds that make us the people of God and form our identity together.

PASTOR STEVE'S LETTER: "A FEW QUESTIONS TO ASK OURSELVES"

As we look forward to the Fall months (which are typically stewardship months that address our time, talents, and treasures), I ran across a very timely and thought-provoking short article. The article was entitled: "Using Words to Frame Questions." If we could frame our stewardship response to God for all the blessings He continues to give us, what would help us process our response in a more meaningful way? The author suggested we use a few short, simple questions. As you read through them, I invite you to honestly answer them for yourself first. The author also believes that if we change our conversation, we will change our results. When we change what we talk about, we change the trajectory of our organization. What might happen if more and more of us asked these questions; first, of ourselves, and then, of others we know and with whom we have conversations. Only God, you and others can imagine the results!

If I could ask 2 words, it would be "Why not now?"

If I could ask 3 words, it would be "Why not now?"

If I could ask 4 words, it would be "What do I think?"

If I could ask 5 words, it would be "What is holding me back?"

If I could ask 6 words, it would be "What am I willing to do?"

If I could ask 7 words, it would be "What would I do right now? Why?"

If I could ask 8 words, it would be "What gifts do I bring to the table?"

If I could ask 9 words, it would be "Who else needs to be part of this conversation?"

If I could ask 10 words, it would be "Is this the best way to achieve our desired results?"

As you wrestle with these questions, I invite you into a season of prayer, reflection, and conversation with God. God is good all the time and all the time God is good. He has blessed us in so many ways and He wants to work through you and me with His blessings to share with the world so that others may experience the marvelous goodness of God. God has created us with special gifts and talents that He expects us to use for the Kingdom in our world. But it begins with honest conversation and confession with God, followed by honest conversation with another. I would invite you find another person and ask and share these questions with each other! Your conversation would be both humbling and exciting. Confession (conversation with others) is good for the soul and leads to God pleasing attitudes and action. Jesus, in the Great Commission in Matthew 28, begins with this action verb – GO! Jesus is talking to His followers and disciples. It is now your turn to go (with all authority in heaven and earth) to share the good news of the gospel (God loves you. He is not out to get you. He loves you so much that He sent us a Savior – a way out of our sinful mess).

P.S. As a closing thought I would like to challenge you like the LORD did with His people in the Old Testament through the prophet Malachi.

"6 I the LORD do not change. So you, O descendants of Jacob, are not destroyed. ⁷ Ever since the time of your forefathers you have turned away from my decrees and have not kept them. Return to me, and I will return to you," says the LORD Almighty. "But you ask, 'How are we to return?' ⁸ "Will a man rob God? Yet you rob me. "But you ask, 'How do we rob you?' "In tithes and offerings. ⁹ You are under a curse-- the whole nation of you-- because you are robbing me. ¹⁰ Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the LORD Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have room enough for it. ¹¹ I will prevent pests from devouring your crops, and the vines in your fields will not cast their fruit," says the LORD Almighty. ¹² "Then all the nations will call you blessed, for yours will be a delightful land," says the LORD Almighty.

PASTOR MATT'S LETTER

"Isaiah boldly says, 'I [God] was found by those who did not seek me; I revealed myself to those who did not ask for me." Romans 10:20

"This is what the LORD says to the house of Israel: 'Seek me and live'" Amos 5:4

When the weather gets cooler, as it did a week ago, and the leaves begin to dry and rustle in the breeze, I think sometimes of my youth at Grandma's house. The games of fall we played like Hide and Seek, Ghost in the Graveyard, Kick the Can, and even the winter precursor – Freeze Tag; it was always fun to run around the yards and find a place to hide to avoid capture. Found some really good places, yes I did; so on occasion the only way I was seen again was when the seeker called out, "Olly, Olly, Oxen Free." Hide and Seek and other derivatives are still part of my life when I get to play a game of Assassin with the youth, I just don't move as quickly as I did to get to the base. The point of that game is to avoid being "killed" by the Assassin in the dark. (The one who comes to kill and destroy.)

Those games were great to play, but the more I think of it – at different times we all are still playing Hide and Seek. Too often in our life without realizing it we are actually playing Hide and Seek with God. Just as the original game began in the Garden of Eden when Adam and Eve because of sin hid behind some bushes from God in embarrassment and fear of exposure, we too find our ways to hide from God. Jonan played the game, but remember – God still found him even though he was hiding on a boat in the middle of the water. (I never had that good of a place.) David played it, too, after his time with Bathsheba and Uriah but God sent Nathan. Peter played, standing right out in a public square when he denied knowing Jesus...turned out that wasn't a good place either. Saul, he played a brutal game of it, but God still found him and got him; and we still play the game today.

God calls for us to be his hands, feet and voice in the world, not just to our friends, but to the outcast and the sinner. Too often we try to play the game to get out of the way, to hide, to hope to not be seen. But don't forget – it's not called Hide, but rather Hide and Seek. And God is really good at this game. He's been winning it since the first game with Adam and Eve. Recently I spoke with an older member and my heart jumped for joy to hear them say, "God has been after me, pushing me to do something, so I answered"... God wins! Our hiding only delays the work of God, and as he said in Esther – if it's not you I will find someone. Why not let it be us? Maybe we should become the seeker.

You know, after awhile, those hiding places got pretty lonely. I felt out of touch and time just seemed to come to a standstill waiting to hear that cry, "Olly, Olly, Oxen Free." But as I did a word search on that line and the word hide in the Bible, I found something interesting. First off in the NIV, the word hide appears 72 times, almost exclusively with us crying out feeling God is hiding from us. He doesn't do that. I also found that of those times only ONCE did the word appear in the New Testament, in Revelation 6:16 when in despair from suffering the people cried out for the mountains to fall on them to hide them from the suffering. Note to self – NOT a good way to hide. So what I found was that where Jesus is, there is no real way to hide, and we don't have to cry out as if he is hiding. My family of faith, He sees it all, knows it all, has overcome it all. You remember His cry from the cross. "It is finished." Perhaps it was His way of crying out what I learned about Olly, Olly...that phrase changed over time. It was in some uses, "Outtie, Outtie, Let's Be Free," and "All-Y, All -Y, All Set Free," and "Outtie, Outtie, All Come in Free." In the game of Hide and Seek it is called out so the Hiders know the one has been caught or found, so come in, come home. You're safe.

He has opened the way for all of us hiders, Olly, Olly – It is Finished. We should hear the cry and trust it, and come out from our hiding places. He is still seeking, but wise men and women seek him still today. Y'all set FREE. AMEN

Confirmation and **FLYTE** have begun again and this year we have six in the FLYTE program as well as five in Confirmation. Please pray for these young people to diligently study God's word for them and for their well-being.

YOU are needed. As we begin to form the new year of learning and passing on the faith, we need YOU to help and teach a topic for our children and youth. Classes are two or five sessions long and range from 1 to 1½ hours in length. Typically a class leader would teach on Wednesday or Sunday but each class has the flexibility of scheduling in agreement with the teachers and the parents of children. Each class has fully documented information and ideas for class time, and the pastors are here to help support and work with you as you prepare and teach. Sunday School Exploration of the Bible has begun. A time of Gathering happens from 8:45 to 8:50 a.m. in the fellowship hall and then all the classes break out into their learning areas. BOARD OF SPIRITUAL OVERSIGHT

September 15, 2015

Present: Pastor Steve, Pastor Matt, Margaret Svitak, Linda Cyboron, Charlie Skoglund, and Becky Bahnfleth.

Excused Absence: Brian Anderson, Mary Weich

Pastor Matt opened with devotions from Oswald Chambers and prayer.

Rally Day Milestones: Pastor Matt shared the three milestones (My First Bible/Catechism; Moving Forward, and Taking on My Faith) that were observed during our brunch after worship on September 13. While the milestone events were powerful for the families and members involved, there is a frustration that some families and congregational members continue to not participate in these important milestone events. We will continue to look at ways to invite, encourage and support our Lifelong Learning for Youth and Families at CTS. We will look for ways for families to share personal stories during worship.

Sunday School: Charlie reported that Sunday school is ready to go with teachers and staff in place. The teachers will begin with group prayer at 8:35 am with an opening that begins at 8:45 am for 10 minutes with the remaining time in class. It has been suggested that our Sunday School Christmas program be held during worship on December 13.

Wednesday Night Schedule: Confirmation and FLYTE will continue to meet at 5 pm and conclude by 6:30 pm. There will be joint work groups that will be added. There will be NO meal at 6:30 pm followed by either worship/activity. The youth group meets at 7:30 pm.

Lifelong Learning: We have teachers, helpers, and co-teachers lined up to implement our MAP (Ministry to Adolescent People), Together in Faith catechetical topics, Solo Publishing where parent(s) and child (ren) come together for 2-5 times of learning together under the instruction of a facilitator. These teachers and helpers will meet for bi-monthly meetings for training and encouragement.

Adult Education: Pastor Steve shared that he is leading a Sunday morning study on Spiritual Warfare for 12 weeks during Sunday school. He is also facilitating all three VantagePoint3 processes this year (The Journey, Way of Life, Walking with Others) with hopes that those who complete these processes will facilitate other groups and Pastor Steve will become an advisor and trainer for other group leaders.

Prayer Partners and Mentors for Youth: Linda is working on having every member of CTS either as a Prayer Partner with one youth Partner (4th grade and under) and/or a Prayer Mentor (5th grade and above). There is a difference between the two. A prayer partner would be given one youth under 5th grade where you would pray for that youth every day, remember their baptismal birthday and their biological birthday, and say "hi" to them every Sunday in church. A prayer mentor (5th grade and up) would do the same as a prayer partner but the youth would also do the same with their prayer mentor. Meeting with each other on a regular basis to share faith stories would be encouraged.

Mercy Meals: Becky shared that the community will be organizing their annual Pack Away Hunger on Sunday, October 18. The times we could work are at noon and 2 pm. Sign-up sheets and announcements will be made at church and Sundays. (Meals on Wheels will be two weeks beginning January 25).

Schedule Plans for Pastors: Pastor Matt will gone the week of Sep. 21-24 to attend the annual Society of the Holy Trinity in Chicago; he has been invited to attend the dedication of the building we helped finance and build (one week in early November); he is also proceeding with his stomach medical procedure post-Thanksgiving (more details next month). Pastor Steve will be gathering those with spiritual gifts as shepherds/pastors to talk about hospitality.

Confirmation/Affirmation of Faith: As part of our discussion with parents, families and the congregations we will have yearly confirmation for those completing confirmation instruction in grades 7-8 and affirmation of faith for seniors who have completed our MAP sessions following confirmation. We will be combining these two milestone events this year on Sunday, October 25, during worship with 6 confirmations and 1 affirmation of faith.

The Board adjourned for the Joint Meeting with the Board of Administration.

HEALTH MINISTRY

"I pray that everything may go well with you, and that you may be in good health, as I know you are well in spirit." - 3 John 2

Did you know? One in four people will develop some type of mental health illness within the course of a year? Anxiety is the most common mental health diagnosis for anyone ages 18 and up, but only 1/3 of those people will receive treatment for their anxiety. Depression also goes hand-in-hand with anxiety. Nearly 50% of those who have anxiety also suffer from depression. Other forms of mental health illnesses can include phobias, post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), obsessive-compulsive disorder (OCD), bipolar disorder, and many others. Many mental illnesses are not preventable, but there are several ways to ease symptoms.

Studies have shown that people who spend more time on social media actually have a higher chance of developing anxiety and depression. This trend stems from a tendency to compare one's life to others via pictures or posts. **To avoid this,** try to keep social media to a minimum and remember that a picture (or post) can say a thousand words.

If you think you might have symptoms, try **seeing a doctor or therapist** to figure out what brings on your symptoms. After that, form a plan on what you will do in or before those moments to try to decrease your symptoms.

Don't be afraid to **seek help** when you are in need. Mental illnesses get harder to treat the longer you wait to deal with them. Making sure you get routine checkups can help this process. Get plenty of sleep, exercise and good nutrition. Taking good care of yourself will help tremendously with any type of mental health illness.
