DEVOTIONS



Read: Ecclesiastes 3:1-13.

Ecclesiastes looks at the world around us, and with an honest gaze, tells simple and important truths. For one, human existence has limits. There is a time to be born and there is a time to die. Death is a reality that influences how we live. Each day has value and is precious as we give thanks to God who created the day, redeems us from sin and death, and sustains us with grace, mercy, and peace each day. It leads to a life that cares for real needs of others (see Matthew 25:31-46). It also takes simple pleasure on our journey of life: "I know that there is nothing better for them than to be happy and enjoy themselves as long as they live; moreover, it is God's gift that all should eat and drink and take pleasure in all their toil." As you look forward to 2019, how can you live with compassion for others and take pleasure in all that you do?

Pray: Dear God, you created us in love that we may love all that you have created. Give us joy each day in your presence and in the presence of all that is around us. We pray for safety in our toil, contentment in our eating and drinking, and gladness in the relationships we have with family, friends, and those we meet along the way. In Jesus' name, amen.
