EASTER VIGIL MILESTONES

Take a moment to tell or think about a recent mountain high and/or valley low in your life.

CARING CONVERSATIONS



Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- What is something you think is really beautiful?
- What does it mean to you that what God creates is both good and beautiful?
- The theme of the Easter Vigil is God's creative work. Why is it important to know that Jesus' resurrection is part of a whole new creation?

DEVOTIONS



Read: Genesis 1:1–2:4a.

This creation story is filled with hope and joy. When God creates and sees that it is “good,” the good noted there is not just a moral good. It is a “well done,” even “beautiful” good. That is how the creation story begins. We know that sin still enters in and destroys much of the joy, although God never lets go of the hope for something better. That something better is the new creation brought about through the resurrection of Jesus. The Apostle Paul describes that “something better” through our baptism as a way to join Jesus in his death and his resurrection that “we too might walk in newness of life” (Romans 6:4). Our God is the Creator God who promises and creates something new, more glorious, and permanent through Christ's victory over sin, death, and evil. God never lets go of creation. With Easter we give thanks that God promises a new creation, a new life that knows no end. Alleluia. How do you find hope and joy in the creation story?

Pray: **Creator God, you have given us newness of life through the resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. We give thanks for your goodness and mercy. Amen.**

SERVICE



God loves what God creates and it is created good and beautiful. How does that influence how you treat God's creation today? What could you do this week that shows your appreciation for God's creation?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



The Easter Vigil is about the newness of life in Jesus. At our baptism we are given new life. The gift of baptism continues daily throughout our life. Light a candle and read Romans 6:3-11. Reflect on the reading for a moment and then tell stories about your own baptism or that of another. Think about ways you can remember your baptism daily.
