15.01 The Congregation Council shall consist of the Senior Pastor and the ten elected members from the congregation.

Proposed

If you have not heard, I have been taking classes with Saint Paul Lutheran Seminary out of Texas. The program that I am in is for Parish Service Certificate, which for those that were part of ELCA it would be equivalent to the PMA, Parish Ministry Associates. All of the classes are online so I do not have to travel to Texas, although it would be nice at this time to be there.

You may be thinking, how did you decide that you would start taking seminary classes? As most know, I have been assisting with worship for a while and there have been a couple times that I thought about what I could do to learn more about assisting in ministry. This summer there were several thoughts that came to my mind. If you would like to learn more about the journey that God is sending me on, please ask.

I am still working full time so I am only taking 1-2 classes a semester. The fall semester I took Homiletics 1 and New Testament Survey. Let me share with you what I have learned in each of these classes.

Homiletics 1 is about preaching. In this class, I had to write two sermons and give them to my peers during our Zoom class. Before we could get to that point, there was a lot to learn. Preaching is not just reading a scripture, writing a few things about it and then give it. There is a lot more to it. It is Universal, Contextual, Personal, Public, Oral, Visual, Theological and Work. In this class we learned how to preach the Law and the Gospel. We also learned how we can look at scripture and study it. Look at the scriptures in this way, figure out the setting, look at ALL the characters, and what is the plot of the scripture. We might even have to look at the scriptures before and after to see what the setting or plot is. The first sermon used Matthew 5:1-12 which are the Beatitudes from the Sermon on the Mount, which happened to be the Gospel on All Saint's Sunday. My second sermon is from the Gospel of Matthew 2: 13-23, Escape to Egypt. I have not preached this sermon yet, but you will hear it on New Years Day as I will be filling in for Pastor Cindy. I really enjoyed this class.

New Testament Survey was a lot harder. We learned a lot of history as to how the New Testament books were picked to be part of the canon. There was a lot of information that we talked about with each book of the New Testament. We learned that who we think was the author, might not actually be them because of the style of writing. During the time that the books were written, they were all orally shared. There were very few people that were able to read or write so the scriptures were shared orally to others. When we talked about the Gospels, I learned that Matthew, Mark and Luke are called the Synoptic Gospel, which means that these three have very similar stories that they shared in similar ways. Then there was John which is not part of the Synoptics, because it was written very different than Matthew, Mark and Luke. As I mentioned, this was a harder class for me, but enjoyed learning about the Synoptics and have enjoyed the learning.

I will continue to take 1-2 classes a semester. I plan on being done in around 3-4 years. When completed, I will be able to fill most of the roles a typical Pastor would fill. I could be part of area pulpit supply, do nursing home or retirement facility services, minister to those who are shut-in or hospitalized, and even lead worship at CTS. The only thing I really couldn't do is marry couples, since I will not be ordained. That takes much more time. I want to thank Christ the Servant and LCMC Heartland District. They have both decided to support me with my journey to receive a Parish Service Certificate. I look forward to each semester and the classes that I will be taking.

## Tanzania Update

It has been a long time since you may have heard about our Tanzania family. So here is an update.

A lot has happened since the start of 2022, including opening two new sub parishes, adding new Pastors and the exponential growth of the Church in Tanzania. When we started the partnership with Tanzania, there was the Main Parish; Msaranga Mandka Center with 4 sub parishes, Betheli, Kanaani, Mandaka Juu and Mandaka Emmanuel. There was a 1-2 Pastors that would serve all the parishes along with several Evangelists.

ELCT Northern Dioses decided there should be some changes made. The parishes that are mentioned above have now become 3 parishes.

Msaranga Mandka Center and Mandaka Juu are now a center with Mchungaji (Pastor) Emmanuel Owoya. Betheli is now called Betheli Msufini with Mchungaji Elizabeth Kway, and a new sub-parish (Ebenezer) will soon be in the planning phase.

Kanaani is now called Kanaani Lombeta, which Mandaka Emmanuel (Mandaka Chini) is part of this parish.

Each of the parishes will have Evangelists serving with Mchungaji's. The parishes were growing and the Dioses wanted be able to serve the people better geographically as there are many that want to worship; however, it is difficult due to transportation.

With this change, it has brought questions as to how the partnership between CTS and Msaranga Mandaka will look going forward.

There has been talk about having a small group of people go to Tanzania in late spring, along with bringing them to America in the near future. We ask that each of you pray about this.

During 2022, the Prayer Sisters and Brothers would still Zoom. If you have any questions, please talk with Margaret Svitak.

December 3, 2022 there was a Christmas Celebration with our Tanzania Family where we shared scriptures, thoughts and sang Christmas Hymns. It is always great to hear them sing.

Going into 2023 there were two questions that came up.

Buildings come and go. How do we help the ministry?  
How do we take the Word and transform lives?

These are great questions to think about with our relationship with the Tanzania family, but also at Christ the Servant.
