Kitchen Remodel

The time has finally come for the long-awaited kitchen remodel. As with any remodel there will be some temporary changes as we go through the process. The kitchen committee has thought through many things to help make this as smooth as possible.

Here are a few questions and concerns that have been brought to the attention of the committee along with any hiccups that are foreseen at this time.

Will there be plastic put up around the construction area? Yes, Kevin has said that there will be plastic in place.

What will be done with the appliances? The stoves will be kept. The 2 refrigerators, dishwasher and microwave will be sold. The appliances being sold will be offered to the congregation first with a deadline. If they have not been sold to someone within the congregation then they will be put online. Be watching for flyers with these items, prices, and deadline.

What will happen to the cupboards? The bottom cupboards will be tossed. If the upper cupboards come out easy and usable then they will be put in the first closet in the kitchen to store cleaning supplies.

What about coffee and treats for fellowship? The kitchen committee has moved the coffee machine & coffee supplies to the south end of the fellowship hall. Once the remodel has started the disposable cups, plates, napkins, etc. will be brought to the serving area. There will also be gallons of water provided for coffee and bottles of water for drinking.

What about a refrigerator? The refrigerator that was in the fellowship hall has also been moved to the south end to be close to the serving area.

What about communion? The communion supplies have been placed on a cart, so it is accessible for worship. This cart will be covered with a sheet to keep it as clean as possible.

2nd Sunday Potluck: The kitchen committee is recommending that these be postponed until the remodel is completed.

During the kitchen remodel we know that there could be other situations that arise as the process happens. The committee asks that everyone please be patient until this is completed.

As the committee has stated throughout the planning process we ask if you have any questions/concerns please speak to one of the committee members. When speaking to one of the committee members this will eliminate any miscommunication and your concerns can be addressed in a timely manner.
