

Remodel of Confirmation/Sunday School Education

2024

This is a remodeling of how/what we are doing as the times have changed. Education was always to be in the hands of parents/sponsors of our youth. To move things back into this model will add to the depth of knowledge and encourage continued growth, not a model of graduation from church, but a model of growing into the church.

Baptism — all families will receive a copy of Luther's Large Catechism, with explanation that this is the tool to be used at home and that parents begin to work on the contents, as promised in the Baptisimal service.

This following material may be changed in order, but all will be accomplished with the year.

Resources: Sola Small Cat Series, Luther House of Study (when it becomes available – free to congregations), Sola Sunday School Bible Materials (copies of all years in office), and any other sources that the pastor/committee identifies.

Bible will be given during a youths education time. A young one for the beginning of the journey and a more advanced as the youth is able to read the more difficult version.

Communion instruction will be offered at the age of a youth understanding that God loves them and they can understand "I forgive you". This is done with parents and youth conversation along with the pastor.

Year 4 and beyond - Continuing this pattern, Sunday school would include all elements of instruction into materials. Videos will be used as youth age up and conversations about all these elements will be wove into how life uses each piece. Review will become important for all students.

Affirmation of Faith service to be done at the time a youth can affirm the promises made at the time of Baptism. This is a conversation with parents, youth and pastor and can happen at any age.

Adult Education should include the Catechism (especially Concordia's write in version), Sola's material on theology, Bible study, sermons, etc.
